

How to Find the Mississippi John Hurt Museum

From Carrollton:

- North on MS Hwy 35 to County Road 41
- Left on County Road 41, travel 1.5 miles
- Turn Right, still on County Road 41, travel 1.3 miles
- Turn Right at County Road 109
- Stay on County Road 109 about 1.5 miles to Museum (Box #1973) on your left.

From Grenada:

- West on Rt. 7 to Holcomb, MS
- South on MS Hwy 35 to County Road 41
- Right on County Road 41, travel 1.5 miles
- Turn Right, still on County Road 41, travel 1.3 miles
- Turn Right at County Road 109
- Stay on County Road 109 about 1.5 miles to Museum (Box #1973) on your left.

From Greenwood:

- North on Rt. 7 to County Road 41 (Avalon Road)
- Note: You'll pass County Road 301 Marker (turn for MJH Grave Marker)
- You'll also pass the Valley Store, where MJH Blues Trail Marker is located.
- Turn Left at County Road 109
- Stay on County Road 109 about 1.5 miles to Museum (Box #1973) on your left.

How to Find the Mississippi John Hurt Burial Site

From Carrollton or Holcomb

- North (from Carrollton) or South (from Holcomb) on MS Hwy 35 to County Road 41
- Turn West on County Road 41, travel 1.5 miles
- Turn Right, still on County Road 41, travel 6.1 miles
- Right at County Road 301
- Travel 1 mile to St. James Cemetery on left, marked by two trees with blue paint.
- Just beyond is a small turnaround with POSTED sign.
Turn around and park on roadside.

From Greenwood:

- North on Rt. 7 to County Road 41 (Avalon Road)
- East on County Road 41 to County Road 301 Marker
- Turn Left at County Road 301

- Travel 1 mile to St. James Cemetery on left, marked by two trees with blue paint.
- Just beyond is a small turnaround with POSTED sign.
Turn around and park on roadside.

From the Mississippi John Hurt Museum

- South on Highway 109 to Route 41
- Right on Route 41 to County Road 301
- Right at County Road 301
- Travel 1 mile to St. James Cemetery on left, marked by two trees with blue paint.
- Just beyond is a small turnaround with POSTED sign.
Turn around and park on roadside.
